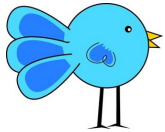

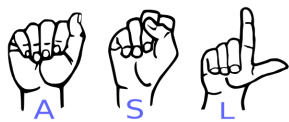

Free Job Corps Program

Vineland Public Library will be hosting free Job Corps orientations the first Tuesday of every month (April-December)! This program will take place on **Tuesday, April 4, from 1:30 - 3:30 p.m.** All orientations will be held in the library’s Community Event Room, located on the first floor.

Job Corps is the largest vocational trade school in the country. It is a FREE, residential program to those who meet eligibility guidelines. The program is open to individuals 16-24 years old who need a High School Diploma and/or hands-on training. Training takes 8-15 weeks to complete.
