

The Vineland Public Library offers its patrons access to many valuable online resources. These include EBSCOhost, Career Transitions, HeritageQuest, JerseyClicks, Learning Express, Reference USA, NoveList, and Small Business Resource Center. Patrons with a valid Vineland Library card can access these websites from their homes and offices. Find links to these databases by going to the Vineland Public Library's homepage, [www.vinelandlibrary.org](http://www.vinelandlibrary.org). Once there:

- click on "Online Resources"
- select the database you wish to use and follow the instructions given
- enter your library card information when prompted

## Legal Forms Library available in JerseyClicks

The New Jersey State Library now offers access to printable legal forms to all state residents with a valid library card. The "Legal Forms Library" provides a wide selection of state-specific (and multi-state) legal forms across the most popular legal areas such as real estate contracts, wills, pre-marital agreements, bankruptcy, divorce, landlord/tenant and many others. The database also includes a comprehensive attorney state directory and a dictionary of legal definitions explained in layman's language. To access the customizable and authoritative forms, log onto [jerseyclicks.org](http://jerseyclicks.org) and click on LegalForms (located halfway down the right side of the page). Enter the number on the back of your library card, without spaces, when prompted.

## EBSCOhost

EBSCOhost is a group of full-text databases containing magazine, journal and newspaper articles on almost all subjects. Databases available include *Health Source*, *Masterfile Premier*, *Business Source Elite*, *Primary Search*, *Funk & Wagnalls New World Encyclopedia*, *EBSCO Animals* and *MiddleSearch Plus*.
