



I just received a letter from my niece, Becky. I will share with you!

Hey Aunt Bea,

It's Becky. I couldn't help but write to you about the comic **Wolverine: Old Man Logan (GN Wolverine)** created by Mark Millar and Steve McNiven. My friend recently lent me her copy, and I couldn't put it down until I'd finished it. The story follows a much older Logan, after many notorious villains have taken over, who is living a normal family life. Money issues lead to him travelling with an old friend to deliver a certain package. Of course, things don't go quite as smoothly as planned, introducing readers to characters and issues of a destroyed and tragic America.

Without spoiling too much, I'll try to tell you why I love this comic so much. In the comic, Logan is older and very broken by his experiences, but he carries on and looks after his loved ones. His character, though in different circumstances, actually reminds me a bit of Logan in the **Logan** movie, which recently came to theaters. Comic and movie are drastically different in regards to story, but I think both share bits of hope and the need for superheroes to rise and fight again in a ruined world, where the heroes had, sadly, lost. Comic and movie are also both very honest.
