Holiday Recipes

Vineland Public Library has many great books on cooking, baking and entertaining—perfect for the upcoming holiday season. In the giving spirit, we'd like to share these recipes from *Williams-Sonoma Thanksgiving Entertaining* (641.568 PAP):

Spiced Apple Cider with Clove Oranges (Serves 10-12)

Ingredients:

- 3 small oranges/ tangerines (about 3/4 lb. total weight)
- 36 whole cloves
- 3 qt. apple cider
- 4 cinnamon sticks, plus 10-12 sticks each tied with an orange zest strip
- 2 star anise pods

Directions:

- Stud each orange with 12 cloves.
- Place the oranges in a large pot, pour the cider, and set over low heat.
- Tie the 4 cinnamon sticks and star anise in a cheesecloth bundle and add it to the pot.
- Bring to a simmer and keep warm over low heat until serving.
- Ladle into cups and garnish each serving with a cinnamon stick tied with orange zest.

Fresh Cranberry Relish (Serves 10-12)

Ingredients:

- 1 large orange
- 1 large tart apple
- 3 cups fresh cranberries
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 thin slices peeled fresh ginger

Directions:

- Quarter the unpeeled orange and remove any seeds.
- Cut the orange into 1-in. pieces.
- Quarter and core the unpeeled apple and cut into 1 -in. chunks.
- In a food processor, combine the orange, apple, cranberries, sugar and ginger. Process until finely minced.
- Transfer to an airtight container, cover, and store in the refrigerator for up to 2 weeks.

Beatrice's Book Review



Golden Boy

Max was born intersex (also known as hermaphrodite) and though he lives as a boy, he doesn't really identify himself as male or female. He's just Max. He likes girls, he plays football, he hangs out with guys. He's a boy. But when he is assaulted in the worst way, he not only questions who or what he is, but also how he is going to survive as a lonely nobody. Max's family seems supportive, until they find out a terrible secret, and then the façade starts to crumble. They have to figure out what to do to help Max before everyone discovers all their secrets.

I found myself making facial expressions while reading this book. That's how I knew I liked it. My face was angry when Max was angry or shocked when I read another twist. While reading the book, I kept going back to the author's bio and thinking, "She's 25 and wrote this? Where is she pulling these emotions from? How can she possibly understand what it's like to be a mother/intersex person/friend when she's never been there?" She's really good at capturing emotion throughout the story. This is a well written book that, with a little bit of push, could have a wide range of interest.
