

HeritageQuest Online is a comprehensive database of American genealogical sources—rich in unique primary sources, local and family histories, and finding aids. Start to discover the amazing “history of you” with this essential collection of genealogical and historical sources—with coverage dating back to the 1700s—that can help people find their ancestors and discover a place’s past.



Ancestry Library Edition, the largest online family history resource available, provides unprecedented access to family history via documents that record the lineage of individuals from the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, Europe, Australia, and more. Distributed exclusively by ProQuest and powered by Ancestry.com, it brings the world’s most popular online family history resource to your library. Answers await all users—professional or hobbyist, expert or novice, genealogist or historian—inside the thousands of databases of family information. User-friendly search tools and comprehensive indexing make it easy to start discovering personal histories. Avoid monthly Ancestry.com user fees by accessing this tremendous resource at the library.

A Photographic Exhibit titled, “Fall into Winter” is being featured during November and December at the Vineland Public Library. The natural light photographs were taken by Shelee R. McIlvaine. McIlvaine's photography was featured last September at the Vineland Library following an exhibit at the Bayshore Discovery Center in Bivalve, NJ. McIlvaine's photography has won awards at the Galloway Cultural Art Center in 2012 and 2013, and one of her photos is featured in the Cape Bank's 2013 calendar.

As the owner and sole photographer of Natural Light Photography-LLC, McIlvaine says, “My vision is for others to see the wonders of nature, landscapes, people and structures just as I do through my lens.” The photographer continues to take photos locally without flash, and whenever possible she uses environmentally friendly processes in framing and mounting.
