Thank You Friends of Vineland Public Library!

October 19– 25 is National Friends of Libraries Week. During this time, the staff at Vineland Public Library would like to thank the Friends for everything they do for the Library.

The Friends of Vineland Public Library organized in 1970 to help build a new library building. Their efforts resulted in the beautiful library on Landis Avenue, which opened its doors in 1976. Forty years later the Friends are still active and their work is still critical to the community library's success.

Last year the Friends' fund raising projects raised more than \$27,000, which they devoted to much needed library resources not covered by state or city funding. More than 83,000 children, teens and adults benefited from 125 programs

sponsored by the Friends of the Vineland Library. The Friends fund: *Summer Reading Program; Family Nights; Kids Talk Literary Magazine; Reading Clubs for teens, children & adults; The Teen Club, "Teen Talk"; the Children's Butterfly Garden dedicated to the memory of Leslie N. Kotok; Non-fiction DVDs; author events; programs for adults, teens, and children and their parents; training for staff; Movie Nights; My First Library Card; English as a Second Language classes, displays and materials; a color printer for the public, Genealogy On-Line Service; downloadable e-books and audiobooks; and computers for job seekers.*

Italian Heritage Student Art Show



Vineland Public Library is featuring a juried art exhibit of South Jersey high school art students from October 6-25, 2014. High schools from throughout South Jersey are participating in the exhibit. An Artists' Reception will be held at the Library on **Saturday, October 25**, at 12:00 p.m. Over twenty awards, including Best in Show, will be given for winning entries during the program.

Renowned artist Burton Wasserman will critique the award-winning entries during the program. Wasserman is a retired professor of art at Rowan University. He is the author of five books, hundreds of magazine articles about artists and their work, and contributes monthly columns of criticism and commentary to *Icon* and *Art Matters*. Wasserman has also dealt with art on radio and television in New York City and Philadelphia. He has held more than 40 solo shows and his paintings, relief constructions, and original screen prints are numbered among the holdings of 35 museums and other institutional settings in America and abroad. The art show is organized by Dr. Frank DeMaio as part of the cultural activities of the Sicilian American Club in honor of Italian Heritage Month.
